WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

BITESIZE REPORT of the Parish Council Meeting held at the Community Centre on the 7th of December 2023 from 7.00pm.

Present: 7 Parish Councillors, Parish Clerk and 8 members of the public

Welcome from the Chairman and Public Participation – no public contribution.

Matters arising:

Neighbourhood Development Plan – Paul Blandford raised concerns that nothing had happened since the last meeting with a quorum was to be raised from the Parish Council. It was questioned if the plan was worth continuing due to the lack of support from parishioners. The clerk has arranged for an open public meeting to be held on the 16th of January 2024 at the Community Centre, starting at 7pm.

Notices of this to be put on the website, social media, and noticeboards.

- St. Peter's church grant request was discussed following the receipt of their bank statements. It was decided to review the financial situation for both parties in March 24
- Planning Working Party the clerk stressed that we were missing closing dates for comments and that support or objection was not enough as need to have the reasons. RG suggested that we ask planning to extend the comment dates when they fall before our next meeting.
- Projector for use at the PC meetings the current PC projector is still in working order although does not have Bluetooth. It was decided that we try and use this for planning applications. Clerk to pass on the PC laptop and projector to ClIr Bliss.

Reports

- Clerk has reported the street lights on Frenchs Road and The Marsh for attention. AB advised that the street light no 13 by the almshouses was also in need of attention and clerk to arrange visit.
- The pot holes in various areas of the parish continue to cause problems and West Drove could go on until Feb 24.

The Crier – clerk reported that the advertising rates had been increased by 10% to help cover the costs. A huge thank you to the editor and delivery people for their support.

Our Facebook page is still out of order. The website was visited 587 times.

WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

BITESIZE REPORT of the Parish Council Meeting on the 4th of January 2024.

Present: 7 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Kirk, Parish Clerk and 6 members of the public

Welcome from the Chairman and Public Participation – no public contribution

Matters arising:

Neighbourhood Development Plan – Paul Blandford had contacted the original contacts who were part of the steering group with only 1 response. He is most concerned that the meeting on the 16th of January 2024 will not be well supported and if residents do not come forward to join, the NDP would have to be ended.

Cllr James could not make the meeting but supported the plan and agreed that more commitment is needed from residents. Cllr Boston hopes volunteers come forward as the plan needs to go ahead.

Cllrs Bliss and Brooks have offered to join Paul on the NDP.

Verdant Energy/ib Vogt have responded to the clerk's invitation to attend a Parish Council meeting and will be at our next meeting on the 1st of February 24 for a short presentation and answer questions.

Reports

The pot holes in various areas of the parish continue to cause problems and West Drove could go on until at Feb 24. Cllr Boston thanked the residents responsible for the Christmas tree. Cllr Bliss advised that he continues to report these pot holes on the NCC website with no response other than "life threatening.

Cllr Kirk advised that April Cottage has been flooded yet again, most probably caused by the development at the back of the property.

The flooding on Folgate Lane will be actioned by the IDB with the dyke needing clearing. The Flood agency at Norwich are looking into the flooding on Bustards Lane and alleged dykes filled in by the farmer.

Two Manhole covers have been reported as showing raw sewage being discharged.

Investment at the West Walton pumping station is required and with only 2 lorries a day allowed it is struggling.

Community grant- still has some funds available.

The Crier – Cllr Eveleigh advised the clerk that 1 advertiser has been lost but interest has been received to take this slot.

Cllr Campion advised that our Facebook page is still out of order. The website was visited 513 times in December and for 2023, the website was viewed 7411 times and Pete Luck was thanked again for his dedication to running the website.

Play area – JL advised that there was a lot of flooding, but this cannot be helped and that the work on the playground has been advised to start on the 29th of January to the 5th of February. Clerk advised that when the dates are finalised, we need to let the Community Centre know.

SAM reports – Folgate Lane IN from 11.11.23 to 24.12.23 had 3,568 vehicle counts with average speed of 26.8 mph in a 30mph limit. Top speed recorded at 55mph at 06.55am.

Wisbech Road (Cherry Tree Farm) IN – from 11.11.23 to 24.12.23 had 24,543 vehicle counts with average speed of 23.9mph in a 30mph limit. Top speed was 45mph at 16.55pm.

Units are now on West Drove North and Swingfield.

Communications/Correspondence:

Re-siting of dog and grit bins to take place as locations approved by the Borough. Size of dog bin under review.

Highways ranger visit – clerk has resubmitted the list of items for the past year.

Planning – to consider Planning Applications, Decisions, Appeals and Enforcements.

Applications:

23/02139/LB – To remove a section of the floor and investigate the condition of the Chancel Roof and external renders at the Church of St. Andrew, Kirk Road. This has been "called in" by Cllr Blunt as questions raised regarding no record of monitoring of the floor and query retrospective. It was agreed to support with the condition that flooring is put in within a 24-month period from now.

Finance

Approved the payments/receipts, bank reconciliation and statements for December – Bank Balance at the end of December was £48,493.96 with £11,335.87 Solar Fund money and £23,000 CIL funding for the playground.

The 2^{nd} draft budget for 24/25 was agreed by all.

The Financial Reserves Policy was approved by all

No public participation. CC and CJ advised that they had stood down as the PC representatives on the Community Centre Committee due to workload.

24/7 free travel to all disabled bus pass holders in Norfolk

From 1 February 2024 all Norfolk residents who hold a disabled concessionary travel pass will be eligible for free bus travel 24 hours a day, seven days a week when travelling within the county.

The decision by Norfolk County Council, means that more than 14,500 people across the county who hold a concessionary bus pass due to disability, and their eligible companions, will now be able to travel on any bus at any time free of charge across Norfolk.

Graham Plant, cabinet member for highways, infrastructure and transport said; "Allowing all holders of a disabled pass and their eligible companions to travel for free on buses before 09:30 opens-up a wealth of opportunities for them. It ensures they have access to work, education and leisure and helps to combat the risks of social isolation which can be associated with having a disability. In addition, encouraging more use of public transport leads to a greener future and helps towards our ambitious net-zero targets."

Previously concessionary pass holders with a disability were only able to travel for free on buses off-peak (all day on Saturdays and Sundays but only from 09:30 Monday to Friday) except for those registered blind or visually impaired.

Offering free travel at all times is over and above the minimum requirement set by government, and is something that a local authority can choose to do but doesn't have to do. The change was recommended following an updated equality impact assessment of the scheme which concluded that it is now unfair to offer a discretionary enhancement to just one group of disabled people (i.e. those who are blind or visually impaired).

The recommendation agreed by the individual cabinet member was to 'extend the concessionary travel discretion of free travel at all times to all eligible disabled passholders and eligible companions, from 1 February 2024.'

GYPSY AND TRAVELLER POTENTIAL SITES AND POLICY CONSULTATION

As part of the Local Plan process, the council has produced a draft consultation document on proposed locations to meet the accommodation needs of Gypsies, Travellers and Travelling Show people in the borough. It incorporates the list of existing sites across the borough, the methodology used for assessment, those sites that are preferred to accommodate the identified needs and planning policies to manage such developments over the plan period to 2039. This is an essential part of the Local Plan process, and this work must be carried out before the Local Plan can be adopted. The consultation would run for a period of 6 weeks from the 26th January until the 8th March 2024, and would help to inform a final proposed Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Show people policy, which will be submitted to Cabinet for approval in April 2024, to be submitted for formal Examination in July 2024. Details will be set out on the Local Plan examination web page: • https:// www.west norfolk.gov.uk/info/20079/planning_policy_and_local_plan/951/ local plan review 2016-2036 examination). To assist the consultation, there will be a representation form. This should be used, to ensure we can capture the information required to allow us to process your response. Please note that representations must be received within the 6- weeks period to be considered.

Councillor Community Grants 2023-24 The current round of community grant funding will close on 31st March 2024, local community groups should be encouraged to apply using the online form. Applications will require councillor approval prior to 1st April 2024.

From 30 January residents will be able to recycle used household batteries. The collections will be weekly, so residents just need to place their used household batteries in a freezer bag, or similar sized clear bag, on top of either their black or green bin on their usual collection day for them to be recycled. It is important that the batteries are placed on top of the bins because if they are not separated, they will go into the body of the vehicle where they risk being crushed which can cause vehicle fires and fires at the processing facility.

Batteries are made from many different materials including lithium-ion (used in laptop batteries), zinc (used in AA batteries) and nickel cadmium (used in power tool batteries); all are recycled into their component parts. The recovered materials can be used to manufacture new batteries and electronics; they can also be used in the steel industry and even in paint production.







Winter vegetable & lentil soup

- 2 small leeks, sliced
- 2 tbsp tomato purée
- 1 tbsp fresh thyme leaves
- 3 large garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 tbsp vegetable bouillon powder
- 1 heaped tsp ground coriander



<u>Method</u>

Tip all the ingredients into a large pan. Pour over 1 ½ litres boiling water, then stir well.

Cover and leave to simmer for 30 mins until the vegetables and lentils are tender.



FENLAND FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY

We cover the Fenlands including South Lincs, North Cambs and West Norfolk. Wishing you all a very happy New Year. Celebrating the coming of the New year has changed; over the passing years. And in different countries. The start of the year has changed at one time it was at the end of March, hence the end of the tax year. Mainly it is now celebrated on the 1st of January. How you celebrate New Year's Eve depends on where you live.

In SCOTLAND they observe First Footing. The first to cross the threshold after midnight should be preferably a dark haired man bring gifts of coal and food to bring earth and food in the coming year. SHETLAND still maintain the tradition of 'Up Helly Aa' with a parade of men in Viking dress carrying flaming torches though the streets to the waterside. There they throw the flaming torches into a boat setting it on fire and sending it out to sea, saying farewell to the old year. In **BRAZIL** the custom is throwing white flowers into the sea each new year, as an offer to Yemoja a god of water to bring good luck in the coming year. In **SPAIN** many people eat 12 grapes eating one grape at each bell strike believing it brings good fortune. In COLUMBIA they carry an empty case round the block it is thought to encourage lots of traveling. In **GERMANY** there is a custom called Glucksschwien which is Lucky Pig. Pigs appear as marzipan treats, and eating them can foster good fortune in the new year. In CHINA colour degood fortune and happiness.Their lucky notes colour is RED. In **TURKEY** they sprinkle salt on their doorsteps at midnight to bring success in the new year. In **DENMARK** the tradition of jumping off chairs in unison at midnight is a symbol for jumping into the new year.

There is no wrong way to celebrate the impending new year, as long as you enjoy it.

On 2nd February 2024, we will celebrate the Festival of Candlemas, so-called because this is the day when traditionally all the Church's candles for the year are blessed. But, like a number of Christian festivals it has pagan origins, being originally a festival of light marking the mid-point of winter.

There are a number of superstitions and traditions associated with Candlemas. Snowdrops are sometimes known as 'Candlemas Bells' because they often bloom before or around Candlemas. Taking some into your house on Candlemas Day is supposed to 'purify' your home.

Candlemas is also the very last day for taking down any remaining Christmas decorations, marking as it does the end of all church celebrations for Christmas, and the beginning of the repentance of Lent.

People believed that it predicted the weather for the rest of the winter:

If Candlemas Day be fair and bright

Winter will have another fight.

If Candlemas Day brings cloud and rain,

Winter will not come again.

So, we all need to hope that 2nd February 2024 dawns with wet and windy weather – at least then we may get something that seems like summer this year!


