This morning, I attended the Walpole St Peter Remembrance Service. At a guess, I imagine, nearly 100 people attended. The



Names of the people from Walpole St Peter and St Andrew who had died in the first and second world wars and in Northern Ireland were read out. Several wreaths were laid on the steps of the War Memorial. The young were very well represented by The squirrels, cubs and Scouts. There were very many proud parents.

I attended a public meeting held over plans to create a huge barrage across the Wash with a new container port. Centre Port, the company behind the £2bn scheme, says it would generate tidal power, protect the Fens from flooding and allow a new deep sea port to be opened.

The purpose of the meeting was to inform the general public about all aspects of the proposals for the Wash Barrier. These range from, green energy production, tidal flooding problems, economic impact, and environmental issues.

Hunstanton Town Council who arrange the meeting, recognises that the public awareness over the proposals and the issues surrounding them is currently quite limited and we would like to ensure our residents and those of North West Norfolk are fully informed.

It was a volatile meeting, but this proposal could have a major effect on our area, and we all need to be aware what is being suggested. Please use link to find out more details of the project.

The next round of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) applications will open in the new year. It is time the get thinking about projects that could be part funded through a grant from the CIL fund.

### **WALPOLE ST PETER PARISH HALL**

We are now on the last leg of our long journey to raise sufficient funds to demolish and rebuild our parish hall. Last month we successfully gained another £20,000 grant bringing our total hall rebuild fund to £342,000. Another big step forward. This leaves two more grants awaiting decision in the next month or two so fingers crossed!

Talks are continuing between the rebuild team, our Project Manager and various contractors, so things are certainly moving forward, but we still need to focus on getting the remainder of the funding in place as soon as possible!

As I am sure you are now aware we have taken the decision to close the Parish Hall as from the end of November. This is for two reasons. One is the exceptionally high cost of heating our uninsulated hall during the coldest months, and the second is to enable us to start clearing the hall ready for rebuild. We would hope to begin the project early in the new year (exact start dates are obviously dependent on us receiving sufficient funding). We understand that this early closure has caused some inconvenience to those who regularly hire the hall but the end result will be well worth it, and of course we look forward to welcoming all our friends and supporters back to a modern and warm building. I for one can't wait.

By the time this edition of the Crier is published we will have hosted our Farewell Tea in the hall. This will be the last event in our old hall and will, I am sure, cause mixed emotions for many. 100 years of memories so far, and with the future of the hall now looking secure, many more memories can be made.

We will keep you informed as to how things are progressing. Thank you all for your continued support.

### Looking after your Faithful Friend

The Canine Care Card is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a life-changing diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.

It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for 'Canine Care Card' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed, loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.

### 40,000 Discounted Trees Available as Part of Norfolk's 1 Million Trees Scheme

Residents, landowners, community groups and schools in Norfolk are being encouraged to join a new push aimed at increasing the number of trees planted throughout the county.

As part of this initiative, 40,000 trees will be available to order at a reduced price offering a great opportunity for individuals and organisations to contribute to the environment and make a significant impact with each tree being 'one in a million'. Tree packs will be available at seven collection points across the county including Norwich (County Hall and Broadland Country Park), Acle, Long Stratton, Watton, Fakenham and King's Lynn.

**Cllr Eric Vardy, Cabinet Member for Environment and Waste, said**: "This is a great opportunity for anyone who wants to do their bit to get involved, this is not only a chance to contribute to a greener and more sustainable future, but it's also an opportunity to leave a lasting impact on our beautiful county. Whether it's in your garden, local park, or even within a community space, every single tree matters.

With over 270,000 trees planted since 2019, I am proud of the progress we have made. Now, we are determined to achieve an even greater impact in the upcoming 2023/24 planting season."

Those wishing to purchase a tree pack will be able to apply online from 13 September. Packs will be ready for collection in the planting season between December 2023 - February 2024.

Once trees have been planted, we're asking people to use our online system to notify us where the tree is, so that can be counted towards our ambitious goal of planting 1 Million Trees in Norfolk over five years.

### Norfolk County Council offer extra support to households this winter

Earlier this year, Norfolk County Council announced it would receive further funding from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) to run the Household Support Fund until 31 March 2024.

The council is receiving £13.4m from central government and adding an additional £400,000 to make the total programme of support worth £13.8m. It is working closely with district, borough, and city councils, VCSE and public sector partners to identify and implement a range of support measures to meet the needs of vulnerable households.

As part of the Household Support Fund, all 47 of Norfolk's libraries will be offering free winter support items until the end of March 2024 (while stocks last). These include:

A bunch of red grapes
750ml prosecco
1 litre cloudy apple juice
ice
250ml sloe gin
50ml herbal liqueur
1 ball stem ginger, finely sliced plus 2 tbsp of the syrup
3-4 sprigs rosemary
1 clementine, finely sliced



### **Method**

#### STEP 1

The day before you want to serve, put the grapes in the freezer for around 8-12 hrs or until frozen. Chill the prosecco and apple juice in the fridge.

#### STEP 2

When you're ready to serve, put the frozen grapes and a generous handful of ice in a large 2-3 litre punch bowl and pour all of the remaining ingredients on top. Stir gently to combine, then serve. Sits well for up to 3 hrs before putting the ice in.

### **Nature At Christmas**

Some say winter is lifeless. It's anything but. It's the toughest time of year, but even at this, the darkest, coldest and least promising time of year, there is still a lot going on if you look around. In December as we approach the winter solstice, one of the largest common owls, the tawny owls establish their breeding grounds during the longer winter nights. So you are more likely to hear the 'twit-twoo' at this time of year, which is actually the "Kewick" call from the female Tawny owl followed by the 'Hoo, hoo-hoo-hoo' male reply.

With the shortest days of the year, it's even more important to get outside in natural daylight during December mornings to keep healthy and happy. You can find beauty in nature even in winter. Woodlands look wonderful with the intricate shapes of branches seen more starkly against the backdrop of a bright winter sky. The bare trees also make it easier to spot woodpeckers, robins, wrens and other woodland birds. Listen out for their songs, as robins and wrens sing loudly all through the winter and never fail to lift your spirits on a cold winter's day.

While there are few flowers in bloom, you may spot golden yellow gorse in flower with its perfume of coconut and vanilla to lift your spirits. There's an old saying that 'when gorse is out of bloom, kissing is out of season'. But kissing is never out of season in December with the tradition of mistletoe adorning doorways and decorating hallways to celebrate the spirit of Christmas. This tradition goes back centuries to the predecessor of Christmas, the festival of Saturn, in Roman times in the 3rd century BCE. The tradition of kissing under the mistletoe however was first recorded in the 16th century.

Another lover of mistletoe is the mistle thrush, a large, upright songbird, which delights in the gooey white berries. It helps mistletoe to thrive by spreading its seeds on the bark of a tree to clean its beak from the sticky residue and also disperses the seeds in its droppings.

And if you're out gathering holly, ivy or other natural Christmas decorations for your home during the festive season, remember to leave plenty behind for wild-life. The evergreens help shelter birds during winter and the beautiful red holly berries provide a snack for many birds, especially those from the thrush family, robins, dunnocks and more

I hope you are all well. Compiling this report on the 30<sup>th of</sup> October to meet Magazine's print deadlines.

To recap on what I have been up too, during October I have attended all Seven Parish Council meetings within my Borough Ward and County Division. I have had site visits with Highway officers and Anglian Water personnel in West Walton.

I attended the Memorial Service in Burnham Market for Tom Shephard the former headmaster of West Walton Secondary Modern School, I knew Tom back in the late 1960's early 1970's.

I am using a percentage of my Norfolk County Council Local Members Fund (LMF) to fully fund two new Bus Stop Shelters on the B198 in Walsoken. The stops are Kings' Lynn bound and Wisbech bound. These stops will service the Community Farm and residents. The stops are expected to be in use soon.

I am also funding through my LMF speed reductions road markings in Tilney All Saints and Bus Shelter repairs in Walpole Cross Keys. I have ringfenced funds for a speed reduction feasibility study on St Pauls Road South, Walton Highway.

'The Sad Tale of The Blacksmiths Family' the story of a great great grandfather.






