Walpole Parish Council news

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Thursday October 6th 2022

The Walpoles Parish Council meeting for October was held in the Parish Hall on Thursday October 6th, Cllr. Andy Bliss took the chair until Cllr Chas Boston arrived.

Cllr James has arranged a meeting with ENSO to discuss the route for the cables from the proposed storage facility to the Sub-Station. The hedge around the play area has grown over the slide and the swings touch it so the clerk is to get a quote for the cutting of the hedge and send it to the owner.

The broken lamp at Chalk Road that a 'large vehicle' hit is awaiting UK Power networks to replace it as the insurance money has been paid. Cllrs all agreed that the repairs to the wall around Walpole St Andrew's Church were an example of excellent workmanship.

The allotment invoices have been sent and the majority have been paid, the vacant allotments will be advertised in the parish newsletter and allocation will take place at the next meeting. Cllr Boston wants to see if any are suitable to divide into smaller plots as there is a need in the Parish after several people have contacted him. Borough Councillor Blunt advised the council to think about the next round of bids for the Community infrastructure levy payments as they will need to be in by mid-January 2023.

County and Borough Councillor Kirk asked if the clerk was aware that the highways officer Mr Wallace would be visiting the area's hotspots for road repairs in November. He also said that the County highways were not aware of the 40mph speed limit for Market Lane, this was very worrying since the money had been paid months ago and West Norfolk Highways said it was in the pipeline. Cllr Kirk is to have discussions with the top man and find out why the discrepancy and why no-one can get replies to their emails to the highways department.

Cllr Campion was disappointed that her recent attempts to organise a litter pick session in the Parish had met with only one response. The website was also down on 'views' this month.

The footpath sign has been replaced at Stickfast Lane and Mr Powers has said the cutting of Stickfast Lane is on his agenda. The Council thanked Mr & Mrs Hunter for cutting back the hedgerow from over the footpath beside the old orchard. Cllr Bliss suggested the council add a brick wall at the corner of the Swing field, similar to that around the alms-houses. He is to obtain a quote from Mr Neal.

Mr Cotton advised that the Neighbourhood plan is now in motion but more people were needed on the steering group especially councillors. Cllr Paul Blandford volunteered and Cllr Blunt offered as an advisor but would have to investigate whether there would be a conflict of interest as he is part of the Borough Planning team.

Mr Cotton caused an upset when he asked that the council re-imburse the clerk for the work she has been doing on the Plan since this cannot be paid from the grant, Cllr Lawty wants to know what the money is being spent on as he is not in agreement with the plan. The clerk has experience of other councils neighbourhood plans and so is an asset to the current project, she said she currently spends 2 hrs a week but this may increase over time as letters must be sent on Parish Council letter headed paper as it nears completion. The clerk will produce a timesheet of her work and when the council discuss the budget for the next year they will factor this in. The steering group will meet again on Wednesday October 19th when they will discuss their presence at the upcoming Christmas events in Walpole St Andrew Church and Walpole St Peter Church when they will have literature and an opportunity for the Parish to find out more about the plan and for suggestions to be included in the final plan.

The Chalk Road development was another cause for eruptions. The proposal is for 4 plots on land that had planning permission many years ago and this was allowed to lapse, the original applicant has passed away and his family are resurrecting the application. This was originally refused as being outside the designated development boundary, the site provides a "visually important gap" between the two villages and this development would create continuous housing the length of Chalk Road. There is no 'provision for affordable housing' and it is within the flood zone3a.

Cllr Lawty took great exception to the council offering approval of the site for the reasons set out above but the majority of the council disagreed as there are proposals to provide environmentally acceptable homes with grey water recycling facilities; triple glazing; and insulation above and beyond recommendations. It was pointed out that anyone with any views can access the planning portal and express their opinions but the council after a vote agreed to recommend approval.

The planning sub-committee will include Cllr James and meetings must be public but will be conducted and recorded on 'zoom' with minutes and an agenda as a normal meeting would have. All councillors can have their say and the sub-committee will only meet if there is not time to pass comment between meetings.

Walpole Parish Council news

The Walpole Parish Council met in the parish Hall on Thursday 3rd November and Cllr Boston was in the chair.

Mr Thistleton, who farms several of the Parish Council allotments asked the council if he could remove a 'stoway' that had been built by a previous tenant for access from the roman bank. He has had trouble with hare coursers churning his newly planted crops with their four-by-four vehicles and dogs illegally chasing hares. The council approved his request as he now farms a large amount of council allotments so this is no longer needed.

The vacant allotments were shared among the 3 applicants with the council retaining one with the view to dividing it up into smaller plots. There have been 5 people approach the clerk for a small allotment so they will be given first refusal. The tenants will need to form their own allotment association and put up fences and sheds as necessary but in keeping with the nature of the plots.

The Council gave the go-ahead for essential repairs to the Play Park. There has been no response from the school about their hedge that is encroaching on the children's play area. Cllrs who are parents with children at the school will approach the headmistress. Councillors concerns included the cutting of grass on the jubilee tree triangle at Walnut Road/Church Road junction; a missing manhole cover on Springfield Road and the new light on Chalk Road still has no power to it even though Network UK have been paid.

Cllr Kirk has also been approached about the setting up of another Community Farm in the area, he says there are already similar farms in this area that are not proving viable and could not see another one getting off the ground.

There seems to be confusion around the emptying of a waste bin at the Community Centre with the bin men refusing to empty the waste bin as it is full of dog waste, even though there is a dog waste bin beside it.

The waste bin at the Parish Hall is constantly filled with household rubbish. The Paris Council are now aware of the colour and make of the vehicle that is dumping their rubbish, it is now a matter of catching them doing it.

Borough Cllr Blunt said he would be speaking at the planning meeting about the proposed incinerator. He will question the need for an incinerator in this area, he is concerned at the distances the proposed waste would be taken from to bring it to Wisbech.

He is concerned about the location just off the A47 through an industrial estate passing a very large school, he recently spent 20 minutes queueing from one roundabout to the one where the lorries would be turning off, which was far from unusual.

Mr Cotton gave a brief report on the progress of the Neighbourhood Plan and said the survey for the Parish was in the final stages of preparation and would run from December 1st to January 12th 2023. All parishioners are invited to have their say on how they would like to Parish to progress in the future, with regard to green space, type of properties, areas where development would be preferable, sites of interest to be protected etc. A link for the survey will be included on the website and social media but there will be some hard copies for those who wish to have their views recorded on paper. These can be deposited in Walpole St Peter Church on completion.

Plans before the council included amendments to Beacon Cottage, Walpole Marsh where it was asked if work had started because the initial plan was approved in 2014. Folgate Lane, demolition of another pre-fab and replacement with a house. Also question were asked if the Walnut Road development had permission for each house to have individual driveways. Another question on that site was about the footpath that should be across the front of the development, wondering what preparation is being done.

The clerk could not present a full summary of accounts as it is too early in the month. She is preparing a draft budget for approval but until full increases from the drainage board and electric company are in it is difficult to assess. The one certainty is that a sum of £3,000 must be earmarked for an election of councillors in the new financial year even though it is very likely that there will not be an election. The precept will be discussed at the next meeting.

The next meeting will be Thursday December 1st at 7p0m in the Parish Hall.





THE FENLAND FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY

We offer support and help to those interested in family history no matter where the family originated. We record and transcribe records in the Fenland area, which covers three counties. We often get requests to look up a record or to photograph a grave for distant members. Not all records are online, so we maybe able to provide the information members are looking for.

INTERESTING FACTS.

I heard someone say 'she is a friend with benefits' thinking it was a new thing. But it has been going on generations.

I have recently been researching for a family who told me their surname had been changed from WHITE to BLACK but not sure why or when.

I have called them BLACK & WHITE they are not their real names. As I worked back through the generations I found a Mary BLACK who was housekeeper to a farmer named Robert WHITE. A closer look told me Robert WHITE was a married man and living apart form his wife, he had living with him an unmarried housekeeper named Mary BLACK, also showing on the census were 6 children with the surname BLACK. So Mary was his 'friend with benefits'! And it explained why the family said their name had been changed from WHITE. We have another famous example of Mr Joseph MEDWORTH 1752 - 1827 of Wisbech Castle. Joseph Medworth was a married man but his wife Sarah nee FISHER preferred to live in London. Joseph Medworth had housekeepers with benefits. When housekeeper Mary ROWELL became a mother he housed her and children in a house in The Crescent, and employed another housekeeper with benefits, Sarah GIBSON aka MILLER, there appears to be at least 7 children by this union with benefits. Joseph Medworth built the present villa known as The Castle in 1816 using material from the previous castle. He also redesigned much of Wisbech including The Crescent. I am sure it is a story you can follow up and learn the interesting story of the life of Mr Joseph Medworth.

OUR COMPUTER RESEARCH SESSIONS. Our main research sessions are held twice a month. But our team is willing to attend local events with a display linked to the theme of the event being held. If WiFi is available can offer family research to visitors. The first monthly research session is in Wisbech Library on the FIRST TUESDAY of each month from 10 - 12 noon. Our researchers are able to help visitors with their family research and show them all the wonderful research resources available in the library. Our other session is on the SECOND MONDAY of each month from 11am - 2.30pm in the restaurant at Baytree Garden Centre in Hilgay near Downham Market.

Our MONTHLY MEETINGS are held in Wisbech Library from 7pm - 9pm on the FOUTH Thursday. There is no meeting in December. If the month has FIVE Thursdays, remember it is NOT the last Thursday of the month. Our speaker on 27th October will be Chris DONALD with the subject 'Unusual Historical Things - Wisbech & The Fens'. Our November meeting on 24th November will be an open meeting with lots of members participation, with an exchange of stories about family history researched, including a very interesting tale by our new committee member about her great grandmother. Also including a quiz and buffet. Plus a display of family trees created by our members. Everyone welcome to attend our meetings. Members Free, Visitors a £2 donation.

From the Church Window

In 587 AD, Pope Gregory the Great sent a monk called Augustine to England as a missionary. Augustine established his seat (or 'Cathedra') and monastery in Canterbury and became England's first Archbishop.

In 1170, Archbishop Thomas Beckett was murdered in the Cathedral and soon afterwards miracles were said to take place there, and the Cathedral became one of Europe's most important pilgrimage centres.

The Cathedral has wonderful stained-glass windows, some of them dating back as early as 1140AD - thirty years before Thomas Beckett was killed. Those windows are full of stories. They tell of life over the centuries and record what people believed and things that were important to them. They illustrate Bible stories and the lives of saints and tell of great moments of history, of heroes from the past, and of those who have brought people closer to God.

But Cathedrals aren't the only buildings retelling Bible stories and stories of our Christian heritage. Many of our oldest churches have fascinating stained -glass windows, some have wall paintings that survived Cromwell and the Puritans, and others beautiful carvings, all keeping 'the story' alive. Our church building dates to medieval times and for hundreds of years people have gathered there to worship and sing praises to God.

Those unable to read would hear the stories told and the beautiful artwork would remind them of what they had heard.

One key festival was Christmas which we're just about to celebrate. The story of a baby, God's Son, born to Mary over 2,000 years ago. His name was Jesus - Immanuel, meaning 'God with us.' It's a wonderful story to be told and kept alive amid all the tinsel and the festive cheer - after all, Jesus is the reason for the season!

But the Jesus story goes on beyond Christmas. Jesus was born to be the Saviour of the world, and a modern carol tells us that he was, 'Born a baby, born a King, born to laugh, and born to cry, born to live and born to die, born to rise up from the grave, born for sinners, born to save.

May you have a very peaceful and blessed Christmas.

Remembering your Faithful Friend this Christmas

The Canine Care Card is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a life-changing diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.

It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for 'Canine Care Card' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed, loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.



Fight Flooding by Clearing Channels

Flooding is a real threat in Norfolk through the winter: keeping even the smallest watercourses clear and flowing freely will help protect homes and businesses safe.

A build-up of flood water with nowhere to drain to can quickly turn a minor incident into a disaster for the home. By checking the drains and ditches on their own property, residents can take action to mitigate the effects of flooding on their home.

To keep your property, and those around you, safe from flooding, property owners must check ditches and watercourses on or adjacent to their land and keep them clear. Even smaller watercourses which may be dry for most of the year, play a key drainage role in wet weather. Find out more about your responsibilities at www.norfolk.gov.uk/flooding

Under UK law, landowners have a responsibility to keep watercourses on their property clear, even if only a few feet of the ditch pass through their property. Hedges or fences that are erected within the boundaries of a property can even prevent owners knowing they have a watercourse to maintain.

Making sure that water can flow smoothly and easily through existing ditches and watercourses will protect properties from flooding and keep the local community safe. Property owners must keep these ditches clear of fallen trees, branches, bushes, garden refuse or rubble and litter will help water flow: a simple test is to ask whether a fish could swim through the ditch or watercourse. If the answer is no, water flow could also be obstructed and lead to flooding of the property. For drains in public places and along Norfolk's highways, the County Council's Highways Team work to clear them and keep roads open. You can report any blocked or broken drains on Norfolk's highways via www.norfolk.gov.uk/flooding


