#### **QUEEN ELIZABETH II**

**Elizabeth II** (Elizabeth Alexandra Mary; 21 April 1926 – 8 September 2022) was Queen of the United Kingdom and other Commonwealth realms from 6 February 1952 until her recent death in 2022. She was queen regnant of 32 sovereign states during her lifetime and 15 at the time of her death. Her reign of 70 years and 214 days is the longest of any British monarch, the longest recorded of any female head of state in history, and the second-longest verified reign of any sovereign in history.



#### Thank-you, ma'am, for everything

Walpole St Peters church has a rich history of Royal patronage. It is within easy reach of Sandringham, and many generations of the Royal Family have been attracted by the church's many charms. While he was Prince of Wales the future Edward VII contributed to the replacement of church windows and his successor, who was to become George V, planted an oak tree in 1909 in the churchyard on the the south side of the church which stands next to the huge beech tree.

Over the years King Charles III as The Prince of Wales has paid several visits to the church and we are most grateful that he continued to demonstrate his interest in the future of this beautiful church and its well being for generations to come. He has been the most frequent Royal visitor, having visited privately many times. This is one of his very favourite churches. He contributed to the repair and replacement of the organ, and in the year 2000 planted an oak tree, opposite the bell tower on the south side of the church, to mark the Millenium.

#### Walpole Parish Council news .....

#### PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Thursday September 1st 2022

The Walpoles Parish Council met in the Parish Hall on Thursday September 1<sup>st</sup> after their August break.

Cllr Boston was in the chair, comments from the minutes included the amazing job being done on the wall around St Andrew's Church. Work is almost complete after being held up by the hot weather, the builder is re-using the old bricks and using lime mortar. Also in the minutes was the result of the play park inspection, councillors felt that if any of the repairs were dangerous they should be carried out as soon as possible but it appears that many of the problems are loose bolts due to the wood shrinking in the hot weather. It is thought that this will rectify itself once the wood has swelled after some rain and tightening the bolts would cause the wood to crack on expansion. The clerk is to ask for a further inspection in a months' time to re-evaluate the problems.

The notice board requested by a parishioner is proving difficult to site and councillors are asked to visit the area of Mill Road with Chalk Road junction to come up with a position for the board.

The problem of overgrown verges is still causing County Councillor Kirk a headache, some verges are the responsibility of the County Council and some the Borough Council. Cllr Kirk is fed up with the Borough Highways department not replying to emails or answering the phone he says it is a total shambles and will be going above them to the County Highways. Not only are the road repairs being postponed but those that are being done are very poor or no better when completed. The highways department has also had money from the parish council for several months for a speed limit on Market Lane. They promised that the signage would be in place early 2022 but this has again been put off to next year.

The work on Church Road with Chalk Road junction which closed the road for several days has not passed inspection and will need to be done again. They also left a pile of old tarmac on the verge in front of a councillor's house which also needs to be removed.

It seems it is not all bad news as the work on French's Road has received high praise and workmen are due to return to attend to a few remaining pot holes.

West Drove North has been a source of annoyance for many years where the road edges are collapsing, a couple of areas have dips that mean drivers are on the wrong side of the road to avoid them and water collects in the dips after heavy rain and cannot get away.

A parishioner had complained of glass on the road after a lamp post was damaged but councillor Brooks has been and cleared all debris which was Perspex not glass and the lamp post will be dealt with in the usual way, the bill for which is £844 to disconnect the supply and £1000 to re-connect.

The clerk advised the councillors sign up to all the policies and procedures and review the anti-bullying policy for next month's meeting.

The allotment rents are due next month and if the council wish to increase the rent they must give 12 months' notice, they agreed a 5% increase as it has been 7 years since the last one. One tenant has given notice to vacate his allotments so they will be advertised in the normal way. Cllr Boston has been told there is interest for small allotments and a notice is to be put in the Crier and if there is enough interest shown it may be possible to subdivide one of the allotments closest to the village.

The Crier is currently breaking even but it was suggested that advertisement prices should be increased, Cllr Boston was sceptical about this in the current climate of rocketing cost of living this might make small businesses think twice about advertising in a Parish magazine. This will be reviewed in the New Year. Cllr Kirk proposed that Walpole follow West Walton who have an advert asking people to donate towards the cost of producing a newsletter.

Stickfast Lane has been cut and a footpath sign was dumped outside the substation which will be replaced. Cllr Bliss asked that the owner of the old orchard cut the overhanging branches from the footpath that runs beside the orchard to Wisbech road.

The Speed monitoring machine is currently on The Marsh and a second one is due to be delivered soon.

Mr Paul Cotton announced that the Neighbourhood plan has been set in motion with the appointment of a consultation Group who will conduct a site visit and provide technical advice. A grant offer being approved. Mr Cotton asked the council if they would consider reimbursing the clerk for her hard work with the plan as she cannot draw expenses from the grant money. The first meeting of the steering group was held in August but only 3 people turned up, Mr Cotton said he needs a couple more volunteers and he invited the Crier's correspondent to attend to write about their progress. The next meeting will be 28<sup>th</sup> September.

Discussions were held about the 50/50 partnership scheme with suggestions for a Parish Notice Board, replacement of the bark on the play park with rubber matting. It is thought that in time the council may replace the current wooden equipment with metal, which it is hoped will last a lot longer.

As Cllr Lawty has resigned from the Sutton Bridge Power fund committee, who offer grants to local groups the Parish Council needs a volunteer to attend their meetings. No-one volunteered so it will be discussed at the next meeting.


There were several planning applications, and decisions to inform the council of and Cllr Lawty as part of the sub-committee gave a report on decisions taken during the August break. There were concerns about the plots on Walnut Road which are all now being developed individually. The ditch has been filled in but there are reservations as to whether permission was gained from the Internal Drainage Board before the work was carried out. It was stated that they are all now making individual entrances onto Walnut Road instead of the communal entrance on the original plans. Also the hedgerow has been removed.

There is an appeal in progress on the Solar Farm and battery storage at Walpole Marsh. All financial matters were approved although the meeting was too close to the beginning of the month to cover all outgoings.

The next meeting will be Thursday October 6<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the Parish Hall.

#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN**

The Neighbourhood Development plan has now started.

A grant has been allocated for the first year to cover the cost of our consultants (Collective Community Planning) and incidental expenses.

The government has also engaged AECOM to provide Technical Support (at no charge to the parish).

We held our first formal meeting in the village hall on the evening of Tuesday 23rd August to start the process.

The meeting itself was a general introduction to the way forward with discussion on the likely areas to be involved.

We have obtained a large scale ordnance survey map of the parish to enable us to plot areas that you may wish to consider in the various surveys that we will be creating to obtain your views.

Our next meeting is planned for Wednesday 28th September in the village hall from 7pm when our consultants will begin to present their analysis of information relating to the parish.

This will guide us on producing our first request for your views and wishes on the future of the parish. Hopefully we can get this out before the end of the year.

We still would like more people to join the steering group (particularly someone from Walpole Marsh) - all that is required is a wish to make the Walpoles a better place to live - our consultants will give the guidance and support you will need.

Now to more local affairs, I was delighted to see a grant from The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Panel of £50,000 towards the demolition and rebuilding of the Walpole St Peter Parish Hall. It is a major project and deserves all our support and will be a major benefit to the village and the surrounding community.

The CIL panel make two more local awards. £11,750 to Walpole Highway School towards the cost of the provision of a portacabin for the use as a library, reading room and meeting room. £2,189 to Walsoken Parish Council for the provision of a bus shelter on Burrett Road.

I would like to congratulate all the applicants and thank them all the hard work they have done to get these awards. This latest round of awards distributed just over £783,000, which brings the total amount we have spent through CIL funding to nearly £3million across the whole of West Norfolk towns and Parishes



# Recipe

#### **Dumpsideary Jam**

Makes 2.1 kg (4lb 12 oz)

500g (1lb 2oz) Cooking Apples zest and juice of 1 lemon 25g (1 oz) root ginger, bruised 2 cloves 300 ml (10.5 fl oz) water

#### **METHOD**

Place all the fruits and the plum stones in a preserving pan along with 300 ml water and simmer gently until soft Remove the plum stones then press all the fruit through the fine disc of a food mill or a sieve.

Place the resulting fruit puree in a preserving pan and add the lemon zest and juice. Tie the spices in a piece of muslin and add this to the pan along with the sugar. Heat the mixture slowly, stirring until the sugar has completely dissolved. Turn up the heat and boil rapidly to reach setting point \*. Skim if necessary.

Remove the spices. Pour the jam into hot sterilised jars and seal.

\* Tip—to test setting point put a small plate in the freezer to chill. Drip a pool of jam onto the plate with a spoon and allow to cool for a few seconds, then draw your finger through the jam. If setting point has been reach the surface will wrinkle. When you raise your finger from the plate the jam will form a strand rather than dripping off.

#### INTERESTING FACTS.

As one of our speakers I attended the Gedney Hill WI to give a talk to the lovely welcoming ladies of the group. What a fascinating meeting place, the hall was named 'Fabric, Paper, Scissors'. Full of every craft you could think of, and surrounding it I was fascinated to see among others animals alpacas and baby goats etc. I thought about the name of the village Gedney Hill, where was the Hill? A little research gave me my answer. The word HILL is a corruption of the word HEEL, meaning a sharp bend in the main road like the turn of a heel. As I drove home I did indeed see the sharp 'heel' bend in the road.

Recently when visiting a supermarket I found shelves either empty or almost empty. Which reminded me of the rationing of food etc during the war caused by the then shortages. Many think rationing ended at the end of the war, but that is very wrong. Some items were not put on rationing until after the war ended, including BREAD it was rationed from July 1946 until July 1948. JAM including Marmalade, Treacle and Syrup was rationed from March 1941 to December 1948. TEA rationed from July 1940 - October 1952, coffee was not available. SWEETS from July 1942 - February 1953. EGGS from June 1941 - March 1953. Dried Egg Powder was introduced. CREAM from November 1941 -April 1953. Other items rationed from January 1940 - September 1953 include SUGAR, BUTTER, CHEESE and MARGARINE & COOKING FATS. Even MILK was limited and dried milk introduced. And MEAT including Bacon and Ham was rationed from 1940 - June 1954. Just imagine trying to arrange a wedding reception or family celebration when everything was rationed. In addition PETROL was rationed until the early 1950's as was CLOTHING including household items like sheets and towels which did not come off rationing until about 1953/4. Brides were grateful to have sheets and towels as wedding presents.

In addition there were no fruits or vegetables imported from overseas, like oranges, lemons and bananas etc. Only home grown fruit and vegetables were available. I wonder how the population nowadays would manage if rationing returned.

OUR COMPUTER RESEARCH SESSIONS. Our sessions are held twice a month. The first in Wisbech Library on the FIRST TUESDAY of each month from 10 - 12 noon. Our researchers are able to help visitors with their family research and show them all the wonderful research sources available in the library. Our other session is on the SECOND MONDAY of each month from 11am - 2.30pm in the restaurant at Baytree Garden Centre in Hilgay near Downham Market. We offer help with family research to any visitors at the garden centre.

Our MONTHLY MEETINGS are held in Wisbech Library from 7pm - 9pm on the 4th Thursday. There is no meeting in August. We restart our meetings on 22 September (the month has 5 Thursdays, so remember it is NOT the last Thursday of the month!). Our September meeting will start with our AGM (a short review of the year) and then we can enjoy the main part of the evening. Our speaker will be Kevin RODGERS with an interesting talk on music. Our October speaker will be Chris DONALD with the subject 'Unusual Historical Things - Wisbech & The Fens'. Everyone welcome to attend our meetings. Members Free, Visitors a £2

EVENTS The event at St Augustine Church included a dedication service of the processional cross honouring the life of Captain Harold Rex NORTON. Our team created a display showing information and photographs about a local young man Rex NORTON showing his early life in Wisbech Gramma School. His enlisting and initial training and swift promotion to captain as a glider pilot. Including a display outlining the operations Captain Rex NORTON took part in including his last operation and his death in 1945. We also were able to research his family and illustrate his family tree, which was much admired by his nephew who came from Oxford to attend the dedication and service in honour of 'Rex' Harold Martin NORTON.



I hope this finds you all well. I am happy to report that I have been able to help another local group within my borough ward with my https://www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/info/20228/community\_grants/913/councillor\_community\_grant\_scheme The 13th Walpole Scout Group are setting up a Squirrel Drey group. The financial help from the grant is helping buy equipment needed. If other groups within my Borough ward would like financial support, please visit the link. As the Norfolk County Councillor, I have A local Members Fund available, this is for use on Infrastructure / Highways. I have used some of this to help fund a new bus stop shelter in Walsoken, this should be in place before Winter.

Market Lane Walpole Cross Keys – Walpole St Andrew 40 MPH speed reduction scheme. It was agreed late 2021 for me to part to fund this, we were told by Highways the speed reduction scheme would be in place by late spring early summer 2022. Highways have now informed me and the Village Clerk, this has been delayed, it is unlikely to be in place until 2023. We are bitterly disappointed with this; I am in conversation with Highways and County Hall to try and persuade them to think again and bring this forward to a time nearer to that promised.

My offer of help collecting shopping or prescriptions for constituents who are house bound continues, please get in touch if I can help. I continue to report Highway faults, including potholes, hedges, mud on roads and fly tipping.

I have received phone calls and emails from constituents with concerns on many subjects, which I have dealt with in a timely manner and the outcome shared with the constituent concerned.
