WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL Bitesize Report Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held 1st of June 2023

Present: 7 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Kirk, Parish Clerk and 3 members of the public.

1. Matters Arising – to record matters arising from the May Annual Parish Council Meeting:

Stolen Post Boxes – clerk has sent a follow up email to Royal Mail but no response to date.

Neighbourhood Development Plan – it was decided that a leaflet need to be sent to all homes in the parish covering Call for Sites, Green Spaces and Heritage Sites.

2. To receive reports:

Stickfast Lane is not recognised by the NCC following overgrowth raised on their website.

The potholes by the tea room on Market Lane, Mill Road and Kirk Road have been reported and parishioners are asked to report via https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/roads/report-a-problem as the more reports the better.

Clerk Reported that the Annual Governance & Accountability Return reports for 22/23 are now complete and will be submitted to the external auditors on the 10/11th June. Risk Assessments on litter picking to be reviewed and the annual play area inspection has taken place with report to follow.

The website has 796 views in May.

The cutting of the footpaths was discussed especially on Stickfast Lane This should be down to NCC. Also requiring attention are Dunces Lane, Kirkfield Lane, Eastcroft Lane and the footpath on Follens Road. The Parish Council may have to pay for the cutting back of these areas out of the precept funds.

A website review will take place as the current site is inflexible.

3. Planning - Applications:

Extension to create 2 annexes at Marsh Farm, Gooses Lane, supported.

Installation of a new vehicular access at land south of Walpole Substation, Walpole Bank, supported.

No decisions at time of meeting.

4. Finance: Approval of payments, receipts, bank reconciliation for May approved with £39,828.79 in the bank accounts. Approval given for June payments(to date).

Bitesize Report of the Parish Council Meeting—6th of July 2023

Present: 10 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Kirk, Parish Clerk and 14 members of the public.

Welcome from the Chairman and Public Participation:

- a. An announcement was made to confirm that the Parish Hall had been granted.
 £150k towards the rebuild. A round of applause was given and all involved thanked.
- b. Disclosure of Register registerable and pecuniary interests was raised. The code of conduct cannot be changed and all councillors to continue to make declarations when necessary.
- c. The playgroup is closing at the end of the month and the school are looking into taking it over.
- 2. Matters Arising to record matters arising from the May Annual Parish Council Meeting:

The Path at St. Andrews Church requires urgent attention and a light topping off. Agreed at £230.

Overgrown footpaths — It was stressed that as many people as possible need to report any such matters including potholes etc., to https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/roads/report-a-problem The more reports, the better.

Neighbourhood Plan update – to feature in the next edition of the Crier.

3. To receive reports:

The "road closure" on West Drove was raised and it was advised that this is not a Highways issue but Anglian Water and the IDB. Expected that it could be another month.

The Clerk reported that the Annual Governance & Accountability Return reports for 22/23 have now been submitted to the external auditor. The Risk Assessment for litter picking to be updated.

A new website to go ahead and it was agreed to go ahead with cloud storage. In June the website was viewed 655 times.

The small allotment holder's spokesperson was present at the meeting and gave an update – now need to move forward with the entrance.

Play area update — Following the annual playground inspection two items of equipment were not fit for purpose any longer and are to be removed. 2 quotes have been received for the rubber surfacing at £18k and £25K. As we do not have the funds to complete this work, it was decided to apply for part funding and support is required from County and Borough Cllrs, members of the public, school etc.

Speed Reports - Frenches Road incoming 9.5.23 to 9.6.23 had 7,458 vehicle counts with a maximum speed of **90mph in a 40mph.** The average speed was 34.3.

The Marsh incoming 9.5.23 to 10.6.23 had 7,552 vehicle counts with a maximum speed of 60mph.

The average speed was 31.4.

4. Planning:

Applications:

Retrospective: erection of fence and 2 log stores at Townsend Farm Cottage, Church Road. Supported.

Proposed stable block at Walnut Tree Farm, Walnut Road – comments by the 23.7.23 Amendment to application for an extension to create 2 annexes at Marsh Farm, Gooses Lane – No observations.

Decisions: Wildflower Lodge, 11 Gooses Lane – approved and 10 Folgate Lane Rejected and now withdrawn. Cllr Smith was thanked for speaking on behalf of the local parishioners. Cllr Blunt was also thanked.

5. Finance:

Approved bank statements, bank reconciliation, payments, and receipts for June 23.

Bank Reconciliation shows £37.944.85, of which £11.259.40 is the Solar Fund

Approval of payments for July (to date).

Qtr. 1 financial review. Despite paying £3930.00 for the church wall which was not budgeted, we are still under budget by £4382. It was agreed to set up an advisory finance working party.

Public Participation:

A complaint was raised about certain members of the public talking during the meeting which affected what other members of the public could hear. Considered rude and a lack of respect for the Chairman.

The Nolan principals quoted from the Code of Conduct were raised and all parish councillors should be aware of these and adhere accordingly.

The Chairman thanked everyone for attending.



MESSAGE FROM YOUR BOROUGH COUNCILLORS





re-elected as Borough Councillors for the ward Walsoken, West Walton, Walpole Highway and the Walpoles. We would like to thank you all for your support and we plan to provide our support to the various Parishes as and when required.

Sadly, the Conservatives, although they had the highest percentage of the poll, lost the administration of the council by the formation of an Independent Group, made up of the Independent Group, Green and Liberal Democrats, supported by the Labour Group.

It will be interesting to see how this diverse group of elected Councillors will work together over the next four years supporting the needs of the Borough of West Norfolk.

The King's Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council had its Annual General Meeting on May 18th. At this, Cllr Margaret Wilkinson was elected as Mayor and Cllr Paul Bland as Deputy Mayor. Cllr Terry Parish was elected as the new leader of the Council. The new cabinet and committees were also announced.

Upgrades to the electric car charging points at St. James Multi-storey car park, were started by BP Pulse in June. The three-week programme of upgrades has created 50kw chargers that can charge up to six vehicles at a time. The electricity will be paid for by the user via an app, using a BP pulse membership card, RF ID card, credit or debit card. To upgrade EV chargers in the area the borough council secured a grant of £195,000 from the government's Office for Zero Emission Vehicles (OZEV) and a further contribution of nearly £90,000 from BP Pulse, as well as its own contribution of £73,500.

Last Monday, I with a group of friends attended a historic tour of King's Lynn.

This tour, from the Saturday Market Place to the Tuesday Market Place, takes in 1,000 years of history. Historic buildings, hidden courtyards and the river all reveal King's Lynn's story from small settlement to successful port and elegant town - along with the stories of the people who left their mark here. It was very interesting and informative. It is one of many guided walks that can be booked through this link.

Walpoles Neighbourhood Plan 2022—2036

Walpoles Parish are currently in the process of creating a neighbourhood plan which is a community led plan that will help influence how the parish develops over the next 15-20 years.

<u>Update on the first community consultation survey</u> 2022/2023

The Walpoles residents and people who work there were consulted on key issues for the neighbourhood plan for 8 weeks from 1 December 2022 to 26 January 2023. The consultation included a survey with 26 questions which asked for people to share their thoughts on what they liked, disliked and ideas of how the area could be improved.

A neighbourhood plan has the ability to protect and influence development in a number of ways such as protecting demonstrably special local green spaces, important local views, and non-designated heritage assets. It also can allocate land for development growth as well as having various policies to help set criteria for planning applications moving forward on themes including housing, design, natural environment and so on.

Examples from the survey of green space, areas with nice views and potential non-designated heritage assets are listed in the table on page 12.

If you have any information to share on why a case could be made to include such spaces in the plan and assess their importance, please do share this with the parish council for further assessment.

If you disagree with any suggestions also share your views too. Not all suggestions given will necessarily meet the national criteria but will be assessed and taken forward where appropriate.

Call for sites consultation 2023

A neighbourhood plan can allocate suitable sites, if any come forward, for residential or employment growth.

The parish council wish to give landowners the opportunity to put any land forward within the area for assessment preferably to cater for smaller scale development on the roadside. The consultation will run for 6 weeks between 14 August and 25 September. Forms can be downloaded on the parish council website or requested from the parish clerk.

How can the local community get involved?

We encourage all to have their say on how you wish the neighbourhood plan to be shaped and what you would like the team to consider.

Looking after your Faithful Friend

The Canine Care Card is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a life-changing diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.

It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for 'Canine Care Card' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed, loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.

I can't believe this is the final newsletter of the year; the weeks have flown by and children have been busy learning in the classroom, as well as taking part in lots of outside activities.

All children this term have been lucky enough to experience some schools trips and visitors within school, so they have all been really excited to take part and enjoy days out.

Reception and Year 1 visited Bewilderwood Tree Top Adventures earlier this term. All of our young people had a wonderful time, they especially loved the giant slides, treehouses and zipwires.

Year 5 will also have some taster days at both high schools by the end of this term too so that they can feel what being at high school might be like. We have also welcomed our new little people into school, who will be joining us in September in Reception class. BEE HAPPY

Most of use are afraid of bees. In fact, a single bee can ruin an entire summers day. But shoud we be so scared of these important insects?

There are about 20,000 different types of bees in the world and only the female bees sting. A bee's stinger is part of their reproductive design. Only the queen can use it for reproduction but all female bees can sting.

A queen bee can be hard to distinguish from the colony but has distinct features like size, colour, pollen baskets and antennae. Queens and worker bees are all female whilst drone bees are all male.

Bee venom is stored in a sack attached to the stinger. The bees sense of smell (along with sight) helps them to find flowers they need to collect pollen which is their preferred food source. They carry pollen on their legs and body from flower to flower and can drop pollen while they're flying, which helps pollinate other flowers and plants. This creates symbiosis and allows plants to keep growing, which keeps our air breathable. We need bees in order to survive!




The buzz you hear around a bee is the sound of their wings beating thousands of times per minute. Don't panic when you see a bumblebee. Trying to squish it or shoo it away could cause it to sting you to protect itself. Instead, stay still and hope that it goes away.

No one should try to remove a bumblebee nest on their own unless they know what they are doing. It's better to contact a pest control professional who knows how to rid you of bumblebees safely. 

Banana, date and walnut flapjacks

Need a tasty, filling breakfast on the go? This flapjack recipe is a healthy twist on the classic, giving you 12 slices to enjoy throughout the week.

Ingredients

2 really ripe bananas, mashed

2 cups oats

1/2 cup seed mix (flax, sunflower and pumpkin seeds)

1/2 cup walnuts

5 medjool dates, pitted

1/4 cup water

1/3 cup coconut oil, melted

2 tbsp crunchy peanut butter

Toppings—nuts, seeds, dried fruits, coconut



Preheat over to gas mark 5/190 °C

Mix all the dry ingredients in a large bowl and add the mashed banana

Add the dates to a mini chopper with a little water and blitz to a paste

Heat the coconut oil, date paste and peanut butter in a saucepan over a low heat until combined.

Add the wet mix to the mixture and stir well until everything is combined (this should not be too wet).

Line a baking tray with grease proof paper and spread the mix on top, around an inch think. Top with seeds.

Bake for 20 minutes.

Remove from the oven, leave to cool slightly and then divide into squares.

With the recent coronation in mind I thought of the changes since the last one including our coinage. I thought back to the coinage then. Most had slang names. We started with a Farthing [a quarter of a penny] called a Jenny Wren, a Ha'penny, then a Penny. Then Tuppenny bit [2 pennies] and then Thruppence was a 3 penny coin. Tanner was six pennies. Bob was a shilling [a 12 penny coin]. A Florin or two bob bit. [two shilling coin]. Then half a crown was 2 shillings and sixpence, and a crown was five shillings. Then there were paper notes 10 bob notes [10 shilling note] was half a pound and 20 shilling was one pound note. A guinea was one pound and one shilling.

There were 12 pennies in a shilling, 20 shillings in a pound. I wonder if any of you have any other names you remember?

From the Church Window - August/September 2023

Now, I wonder when you last had a Mars bar? I was thinking about work-life balance, and I had a sudden flashback to the old television adverts for Mars bars. Many of you will remember the slogan and tune that goes "A Mars a day helps you work, rest and play". This was a famous slogan first adopted for the chocolate bar in the 1960s, dropped in 1997 but briefly reintroduced ten years later, with a video of monks bellringing. If you haven't seen it look on YouTube. The idea of the video was that eating a Mars bar aided exercise. I am sure nutritionists might take dispute with that but, nevertheless, the original slogan has remained memorable.

We all need work, rest and play and getting the balance right is important for our physical and mental health. None of us can go flat out at work without risking burnout and none of us can just rest without losing the ability to move and be productive. Many of us find it difficult to get the balance right.


