Bitesize Report of the Parish Council Meeting 7th of September 2023

Present : 10 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Kirk, and 18 members of the public.

Welcome from the Chairman and Public Participation:

A parishioner spoke about the battery storage units. A plan was handed round for everyone to see. They read out a letter which had been sent to the Borough Council lawyers. They requested the Parish Council to be notified of the discharge conditions

Matters Arising -

Stickfast and Dunces Lanes have had some cutting back, but the Parish Council are having to pay for this out of the precept and will be seeking quotes for 2-3 cuts a year.

Overgrown footpaths – It was stressed again that parishioners need to report any such matters including potholes etc., to <u>https://</u>www.norfolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/roads/report-a-problem

Neighbourhood Development Plan update – The Parish website has received 7 applications calling for land which are to be discussed. A meeting will be arranged once all the info is in and more parishioners are required to help with the project. Awaiting confirmation of the funding for this financial year.

To receive reports:

CIL grant towards the work required at the playground, unfortunately the meeting ran out of time and so there was no discussion on our application for funding. It is hoped to hear in October.

Play area update – Cllr Luck has attended training and is now making regular checks and risk assessments. These checks have been completed on a weekly basis and identified a number of small issues which are put together on a list. Cllrs Bliss and Eveleigh have the list and will undertake the maintenance. New signage was approved and clerk to order.

Concern was raised regarding the situation at the Community Centre.

Speed Reports from Cllr Eveleigh:

Church Road out – 10.6.23 to 8.7.23 had a total of 5546 vehicles with an average speed of 25.5mph. The maximum speed recorded was **80mph** on the 14^{th} of June.

Frenchs Road out – 9.5.23 to 9.6.23 had a total of 7,458 vehicles with an average speed of 34.3mph. The maximum speed recorded was **90mph!** on 29.5.23

Planning:

23/01387/F – ClIr Blunt suggested it is called in but a representative from the PC needs to attend. ClIr Lawty proposed refusal and ClIr James seconded, all in favour.

10 Folgate Lane – Cllr Lawty proposed refuse on the basis of lack of evidence. Cllr Brooks seconded, and all were in favour less Cllr Smith as she had temporarily left the room.

Finance:

Approved bank statements, bank reconciliation, payments, and receipts for July & August 23. Bank Reconciliation shows £28,129.71 with £11,259.40 in the Solar Fund account.

Public Participation

A parishioner stated West Drove North is in a bad state of repair. He also discussed extra issues with Folgate lane if battery storage is installed. Suggesting a traffic management plan. Cllr Boston advised this is out of our remit.

Next Meeting will be on the 5th of October 2023 at the Parish Hall, from 7.00pm

MESSAGE FROM YOUR BOROUGH COUNCILLORS I am writing this on Friday 8th Sept, A year since our beloved Queen Elizabeth II died. Time flies Remember every second counts.



A final decision will be made early next year on whether an incinerator will be built in Wisbech. MVV Environment wants to burn 500,000 tonnes of waste a year at a new plant on an industrial estate on the outskirts of town. It would be converted into energy for local businesses, by a plant which would be one of the biggest of its kind in Europe. Now the Planning Inspectorate, which oversees so-called nationally significant developments, has said it will make its recommendation on whether the scheme should go ahead by November 21. A final decision will then be announced within three months.

The inspectorate's recommendation will go before Claire Coutinho, the new secretary of state for energy security and net zero, who replaced Grant Shapps when he was made defence secretary in a cabinet reshuffle last week.

Councillor Community Grants 2023-24 A new round of community grant funding was launched on 7th August, with each councillor having up to £1,000 to support local groups in their ward. Grants of £50-£1,000 can be awarded, so a councillor may make a single award of £1,000 or several smaller ones. Where a ward has multiple councillors, they can work together to pool their allocation. In January 2023, the Inspectors adjourned the Local Plan Examination Hearing and subsequently (30 January 2023) wrote to the Borough Council, setting out the additional work that would be necessary for the Examination to continue. The Inspectors' letter specified the additional work that the Council was required to undertake.

In response, we have now published a series documents, for consultation:

Full details of the consultation are set out in the <u>Local Plan examination</u> web page.

The consultation will run for 6 weeks, starting on Friday, 8 September. The consultation ends at **11.59pm on Friday**, **20 October 2023**

The Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk runs a Council Tax Support Scheme, which is designed to help working age people with the cost of their Council Tax if they are on a low income. This is separate from the Government's national scheme for pension age people. This scheme is reviewed annually and each time the council invites all residents to have their say on the scheme - that consultation is now open. Details of the proposed scheme and the consultation questionnaire are available on the council's website at https://www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/ ctsconsultation. The consultation closes on 1st October 2023.

Looking after your Faithful Friend

The Canine Care Card is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a lifechanging diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.

It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for 'Canine Care Card' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed, loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.

From the Church Window – October/November 2023

I was out walking recently and looking at some tree branches and that saying came to me: 'out on a limb'. If you look it up in a dictionary you find it means the following: "Being in a precarious position, a weak or risky situation, vulnerable; isolated, stranded, segregated, set apart, cut off."

None of us would choose to be in this position, but occasionally circumstances call for it. Sometimes we have to go 'out on a limb' – maybe to speak out over an injustice, or to say something kind to someone just because they need to hear it, or to make that phone call we feel prompted to make, or to speak out about our deepest beliefs.

Some might say faith – our faith in God – is a personal, private thing, and that's true, but faith isn't meant to be only personal and private. The benefits faith gives us are things we are meant to share. When we are comforted we are to comfort others – with the love God shows us we are to love others. Sometimes we're prompted to go 'out on a limb' to express or share what we believe.

In other parts of the world people are being persecuted or even killed for doing just that, even if it has led them simply to show love and kindness to others. We, thankfully, are free to speak about what we believe and to express our care for others inspired by faith.

If you take a walk near the beautiful trees we are so blessed to live alongside, I wonder if a saying, a thought or a moment of inspiration will come to you. Nature has a way of 'speaking' to us, refreshing us and enhancing our wellbeing. As the prayer says: God of the hills, give us strength. God of the skies, restore in us light and joy. God of the deep oceans, fill us with deep peace. God of all the earth, enfold us in love. Amen.



Toffee apple and pear strudel

Bursting with juicy apples and pears with a toffee twist

Ingredients

- 2 Gala apples, peeled, cored and finely sliced
- 1 Conference pear, peeled, cored and chopped
- Zest and juice of 1 lemon
- 50 g raisins
- 2 tbsp light soft brown sugar
- 50 g mini butterscotch pieces
- 30 g unsalted English butter, melted
- 5 sheet ready-rolled filo pastry
- 1 tsp icing sugar

Method

Step 1

Preheat the oven to 190°C, fan 170°C, gas 5. Put the apples, pear, lemon zest and juice, raisins, brown sugar and butterscotch pieces in a large bowl and mix together.

Step 2

Line a baking sheet with baking parchment. Lay a sheet of filo on the lined baking sheet and brush with melted butter. Repeat with the remaining sheets of filo, brushing each with butter. Place the fruit filling along a long edge of the pastry, leaving an inch space at either end. Using the baking parchment to help you, roll the pastry up around the filling, folding in the ends to seal.

Step 3

Brush the top of the strudel with the remaining butter, then bake for 20 minutes, until crisp and golden. Dust with icing sugar, slice and serve warm.


