WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL

Bitesize Report 2.2.23

10 councillors, parish clerk and 5 members of the public were present.

A member of the public questioned why Parish Council allotment land was not being
offered for the battery storage facilities as it would provide a source of income. RG
advised that the companies involved liked to deal with land owned by single owners and they prefer larger plots.

2. Matters Arising:

Strimming - Chalk Road, Market Lane, Wisbech Road, Walnut Triangle and Village gateways

It was decided that the clerk contact our contractors for a quote.

A Highways site visit with Andy Wallace has taken place and the list of items for attention were viewed Included the puddles on road surfaces, potholes, gateways, new footpath on Church Road and trod, the missing 20mph sign on Springfield Road and drainage on the Walnut Road new development.

It was agreed to donate to the British Legion of £80.00

Project Swingfield/Almshouses area, to tidy the area including walls and overgrowth. Quote for the work has been received from Mr. Neal for £3920.00.

3. To receive reports:

a. Potholes by Eastleigh House on the Chalk Road bend have been reported.

Washdyke potholes also reported again. It was suggested that details of claiming back on tyre/wheel damage caused by potholes, should be in the next edition of the Crier.

Pothole on Springfield to be reported.

- 2-3 cars parked the wrong way on Walnut Road junction with West Drove North are causing problems with oncoming traffic and this also to be reported in the next Crier as it is illegal.
- CBN advised reports from residents: light flickering on French's Road, clerk advised that this has already been reported. Mud on the roads after highways work completed and the signs require cleaning Clerk to request Highways to action
 - Police Road, Wisbech triangle no give way markings or signs? To be reported.
- New footpath on Church Road still has the grit bin to re-site and the 30mph signage to re-install.

County & Borough councillors reports:

County Cllr Kirk reported that a member of the public had written to him complaining about the road closures not being advised, HGVs on French's Road and why were the residents not consulted. Cllr Blunt has followed up on this and offered to visit the resident to discuss further. Cllr Kirk had also received the complaints regarding the new path on Church Road.

Borough Cllr Blunt advised regarding residents complaints regarding the closure of roads etc., he has asked the enforcement officer to look into this and he has offered to meet the resident. He will look at the mud on the road as the developers should pay for this.

Budget - £4.50 increase on Band D. The Borough Council receive 7% of the council tax with 3% of that to IDB. The budget will go to cabinet next week and full council on the 23rd of February.

Elections - from the May 23 elections, photo ID is now required for voters.

Recycling centres to close on Wednesday afternoons as part of the budget cuts.

<u>SAM 2 reports</u> – Walpole Bank had recorded a top speed of 65mph in a 40mph, with 5611 vehicles and average speed of 35.1mph (18.12.22 – 17.1.23). The second unit on Chalk Road from the same period reported a top speed of 55mph in a 30mph limit with 8977 vehicle counts and an average speed of 26.6 mph.

Neighbourhood Plan update – Mr. P Cotton: advised that the results of the survey were disappointing, and a full report was due. The design codes report updates were also due this week and will be discussed at the next NPD meeting later this month.

Communications and Correspondence

Market Lane speed reduction update – JK advised no update, and he will chase again.

Overflowing bins at St Peters Church reported by a visitor to the clerk and Cllr Brooks is sorting this out.

4. Finance:

Approved payments, receipts, bank reconciliation and statements for January 23rd. Bank Reconciliation shows £47,571.74 plus approval of February payments to date.

5. Public Participation

- a. A question was made regarding the Solar Fund monies, and it was explained that this was granted a few years ago for use on public projects e.g., Community Centre car park and donation to the Parish Hall rebuild. It was also explained that a letter went out to all residents at the time asking for their comments and the Community Centre and Parish Hall were key projects raised.
- b. Information was requested on the battery storage facilities including fire safety/ response – invite a fire officer to address a meeting? Residents need to be aware of any potential issues.

Road damage – advised that the contractors are liable to ensure the roads are in the same state as when the works commenced.

WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL

Bitesize Report 2.3.23

5 Parish Councillors, County Cllr Kirk, Borough Cllr Blunt, Parish Clerk and 6 members of the public were present.

1. Matters Arising

Strimming – Chalk Road, Market Lane, Wisbech Road, Walnut Triangle and Village gateway

The clerk had a quote from Blackamore for £126 for 3 cuts and this was accepted.

Vehicles parking on the footpath at St. Andrews Church, a new set of gates are now in place and a heavy duty padlock and parking post to be ordered.

Parish Council Meeting reports in the Crier had been raised at previous meetings and to prevent any further queries, it was decided that the clerk will send a precis of the meetings to the Crier from February 23 onwards.

Mrs Irene Hunter was thanked for all her hard work and support over the last 40 years.

2. To receive reports:

A review of the increase in litter in the village and Dunces Lane was named as a large number of dog poo bags were just left. A suggestion of dog bins at the start and end of the lane was requested for the next meeting agenda.

The replacement streetlight on Church Road is now in place but awaiting switch on.

The Grit bin on Church Road is still on its side but as it is full, it requires emptying, re siting and then refilling.

County & Borough councillors report

Cllr Kirk confirmed that the Market Lane speed limit of 40mph should become effective from the 20th of March as advised by Highways. The litter problem is the same in other parishes.

The mobile library faces some cuts due to lack of support.

Cllr Blunt – The BCKLWN budget has been approved along with all precept requests. Council tax bills are in the process of being issued. It was stressed that all services will be maintained and that the IDB takes a good chunk of their funds.

The Medworth Incinerator (Wisbech) has held public meetings last week and some excellent speeches were made against the project including key issues of traffic management.

Cllr Blunt had followed up on a parishioner's issue with traffic on Walpole March.

Clerk Report – Small allotments are now all tenanted expect for plot 1 which requires drainage.

Calls in February were 23 with 19 emails. Working on policies & procedures for the internal audit and the last day for payments this month will be the 28th. Information on the election on the 4th of May on the website.

Village Crier/social media/Website - The Clerk advised more new advertisers for the Crier were received in February increasing revenue by £144.

The Community Fund Projects Working Group – The damage to the Christmas Tree was raised and it is hoped that the tree will grow back.

<u>SAM 2 reports</u> – Folgate Lane incoming from 17.1.23 to 8.2.23. with the average speed of 26.4mph taking into account slow moving traffic. The top speed was 55mph and total vehicles 2,867. Market Lane incoming from 17.1.23 to 15.2.23. with the average speed at 28.9mph. Top speed was 55mph and total vehicles 24,442.

Neighbourhood Plan update – Mr. P Cotton: Mr. Cotton stressed that the information regarding Call for sites, Green Spaces and Non designated heritage assets have to be discussed and decisions made by the Parish Council and be reviewed at the next meeting. The survey only had 29 returns and the fact that the increase in CIL money from 15-25% was seriously affected by self builds which do not have to pay this money.

Communications and Correspondence

A Donation request has been received from the First Responders in our parish for equipment and uniforms. WB advised he has put a request for £1k to the Sutton Bridge fund and they advised that the request has to be completed by the East Anglian Ambulance Service. Clir Blunt advised that they should contact the Borough who may have funding available.

Planning- an application has been received for a change of use of bungalow from a dwelling to a children's home for up to three children at 10 Folgate Lane, Walpole St. Andrew. This was discussed in some detail and issues were raised regarding the age of the children, how the 2 bedroom bungalow could sleep them with a carer, previous history, where the children are coming from, if any young offenders and it was agreed that we need more information to be able to make any decisions. Members of the public present also raised concerns. It was stressed that the parish council appreciates that children are entitled to a safe home.

3. Finance

Approval of payments, receipts, bank reconciliation and statements for February 23 plus March payments to date.

4. Public Participation

- a. The improvements on Church Road were liked and it was noticed that the school children were cycling on the road.
- b. The question why Parish Council allotment land was not being offered for the battery storage facilities as it would provide a source of income was raised again. As advised by ClIr Green at the February meeting these companies involved liked to deal with land owned by single owners and they prefer larger plots.
- c. At the crossroads on Marsh Road and King Johns Bank a van and car are regularly parked causing visibility issues. It was advised that this was a police matter and it had been reported.

Mud on Pidgeon Street, the attitude of the cabling workmen had improved, and they are now cleaning up daily. Suggestion that the councillors look at "15-20" minute City on YouTube as concern that King's Lynn will turn into a split town. Cllr Blunt advised that this was not going to happen.

Meeting ended 20:44 hrs.

Parish Hall Update

The quest to rebuild our Parish Hall continues. We have now submitted our full Proposal to the National Lottery for a £150,000 grant. We successfully reached the second stage of application which was our first major step, and they visited us last month to further discuss our application. As with every grant we never know if we will be successful until we receive their offer but we all have our fingers crossed that we get a good result. We have done our best. We are also awaiting the outcome of other grants and continue to apply for new ones on a regular basis. A visit from James Wild our local MP secured his support for our project so work is still very much ongoing but it is vital that we keep the money coming in.

2023-24 King's Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council Budget

At last month's Full Council meeting, councillors approved the council's budget, and the level of its portion of the overall 2023/2024 council tax bill.

It was agreed that the borough's element of the council tax bill would reluctantly have to be increased, due to significant pressures, by £4.50 (£5.00 with special expenses) for the entire year on an average Band D Property, increasing to £143.87 for 2023-2024. This equates to a proposed rise of just under 9p per week, a much lower-than-inflation increase of 3.2%. The increase on lower-banded properties will be less than this amount.

Of this £143.87, a levy of £61.28 is paid to the Internal Drainage Board for the work they do to reduce flood risk to people, property, and infrastructure, and to manage water levels for agricultural and environmental needs.

When drainage board levies are removed from other Norfolk district council tax demands, it shows that the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk charges the lowest amount of council tax in Norfolk, even though it operates over the largest geographical area and bears all the increased costs and complexities related to delivering services across 500 sq miles. In fact, the borough remains one of the lowest charging shire district councils in the country (179th out of 181).

Despite cost pressures and unprecedented economic volatility brought by the pandemic and war in mainland Europe, this budget is not recommending cuts in services or massive increases in fees and charges. Charges that impact on many residents like car parking and brown bin charges are frozen for this year. Services will be maintained at current levels or improved.

The council's ambitious plans for transformational change, supported by government, county council and partner funding, will continue to bring economic, environmental, and educational improvements to the area.

This funded budget has been achieved by constantly reviewing the financial situation, looking ahead, prudential planning, and working effectively with partners. An approach that will continue across the remaining period of the plan.



LOCAL ELECTIONS—PHOTO ID

To help people meet the new requirements for presenting photo ID when voting at the local elections in May, the borough council is putting a range of measures in place, including drop-in sessions for people without internet access. Most people won't need to do anything because the list of acceptable forms of ID is long and even out-of-date ID will be accepted – they just need to remember to take their ID with them. People who don't have a photo ID at all can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate and the council can help with this.

The borough council's chief executive, Lorraine Gore, explains: "The easiest way to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate is online and the process is quite straightforward – as long as you have internet access and a camera, you can do it. "We know that not everyone has internet access so we are also arranging drop-in sessions, where we can complete the whole process for you. All you need to do is make sure you bring your National Insurance number or other documents that can prove your identity". However, don't worry if you can't do either of these. You can apply for a certificate by post, or alternative option is to apply for a postal vote, which does not require a photo at all.

Acceptable forms of photo ID include*:

- UK-issued driving licence or passport*
- Bus pass
- Blue badge
- PASS proof of age card

*As long as the photo still looks like you and your name on the ID is the same as your name on the electoral register, it doesn't matter if the ID is out of date. For a full list of acceptable photo ID, please visit: https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/voter/voter-id/accepted-forms-photo-id.

To apply for a Voter Authority Certificate online, visit: https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate. Applicants need their National Insurance number or other documents (which must be scanned in or uploaded), such as utility bill, council tax statement, birth certificate, and a passport-style photograph. Full details provided on the gov.uk website. The county's libraries are also able to offer some help with the process, including free access to public computers and WIFI, at any time that the library is open. They can also give people one-to-one support to go through the process by appointment. At libraries voters will need to take their National Insurance number and, importantly, their own device that can be used to take and upload a photograph, even if they are going to the library for support. If visiting a library for help voters should check local opening times and make an appointment if one-to-one help is needed.

If you do not have internet access, call 01553 616200 for a paper form to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate or to request a postal vote.



NEWS FROM THE MAGPIE CENTRE

The Magpie Centre, home of West Norfolk Riding for the Disabled Association, was recently awarded a £10,0000 grant from the Masonic Charitable Foundation, (MCF) and welcomed a group of Norfolk Freemasons on a fact-finding visit.

Mr Stephen Allen, Head of Norfolk Freemasons; Mr Robin Shaw, Provincial MCF representative and Mr Michael Spalding, Norfolk Freemasons' Provincial Communications Officer, visited the Centre, at Wallington Hall, South Runcton and met Mrs Bee Ford. West Norfolk RDA Chairwoman, plus several trustees and volunteers.

After tea and cakes, they spoke to Mr Aynsley Calvert and Ms Michelle Alflatt, two of the Magpie Centre's adult riders, and heard from them the difference that riding had made to their lives.

Mr Allen then presented them with rosettes, awarded by RDA National Office, for their participation in the RDA Dressage Championships, which were held 'virtually', owing to the pandemic.

RDA riders are grouped according to their levels of disability, and Ms Alflatt gained 6th place in Grade 1 (for the most disabled riders), while Mr Calvert placed in Grade 7 (Intellectual Disability).

The presentation took place in the Sensory Garden, opened by HRH the Princess Royal in July 2021, and the visitors met WNRDA Trustees Mrs Jan Calvert, whose idea it was, and Mr Andy Beeston, who, with his team of volunteers, undertook the construction work.

The wheelchair-friendly garden forms an excellent venue for the Centre's Tea With a Pony initiative, whereby older people, those with mobility issues, dementia, or who just like to socialise, can meet for tea and cakes and stroke some of the Centre's gentle ponies. This programme runs from April to October. To book, call the Magpie Centre Office on 01553 810202.

Trustee Mr Gerry McKenna was also on hand to outline the work of Equine Assisted Learning Therapy (EALT), a non-mounted activity which helps people with mental health issues to develop confidence, self-esteem and communication skills. Highlight of the day was meeting RDA rider Isaac Everitt, aged 6, riding Ginger.

Isaac's mother, Ms Jennifer Reeves, explained that Isaac, who is on the autistic spectrum and has Global Developmental Delay, had progressed rapidly since starting to ride in September 2022.

'I've noticed a huge improvement in Isaac's listening, communication and speaking skills since he started riding at the Centre,' she said.

At present the Centre has 12 equines, ranging from mounts suitable for tiny children, up to Irish Draft horse Ava, who carries the bigger riders. However, we are on the lookout for more horses, from 15.2 hh to 16.2 hh, for riding and/or carriage driving lessons.

We deliver 72 riding lessons per week, split 50/50 between child and adult riders, plus 19 carriage driving lessons, but there are currently 16 applicants on the waiting list.

Our next major fundraising event is a Quiz and Hog Roast, (with vegetarian option), plus a huge range of salads and desserts, to be held Saturday April 22 at Stowbridge Village Hall, Downham Road, Stowbridge, PE34 3PW. Doors open at 7.00 pm for a 7.30 pm start. Bring Your Own Drinks! Teams of 4 – 8 people are usual, but please feel welcome to come along and make up a team on the night. Hot Cross Bread & Lemon Pudding

Ingredients

knob of butter, for the dish
4 stale hot cross buns
200g lemon curd
2 large eggs
200ml double cream
200ml milk
½ tsp vanilla extract
4 tbsp caster sugar
Little lemon zest
cream or vanilla ice cream, to serve (optional)

<u>Method</u>

STEP 1

Butter a 1-litre baking dish that will quite snugly fit the buns. Cut each bun into 3 slices, and sandwich back together with a generous spreading of curd. Arrange buns in the dish.

STEP 2

Whisk egg, cream, milk and remaining curd, then sieve into a jug with the vanilla and 3 tbsp of the sugar. Pour over the buns and stand at room temperature for 30 mins for the custard to soak in.

STEP 3

Heat oven to 160C/140C fan/ gas 3. Scatter the remaining sugar and lemon zest over the pudding. Bake for 30-40 mins until the top is golden and the custard gently set. Stand for 5 mins, then serve with cream or vanilla ice cream, if you like.



New Parish Safeguarding Officer for Walpole St Peter, Clenchwarton and West Walton

Until recently the role of Parish Safeguarding Officer (PSO) for the three churches had been undertaken by the very overworked Rector for all three Parishes, the Revd. Barbara Burton, who also has responsibility for a further five churches for weddings, baptisms and funerals.

Jan Taylor, who moved to Clenchwarton with her family in 2021 and started attending St Margaret's church, had been the Safeguarding Office in her previous parish of Abbots Langley, Hertfordshire. When she realised the situation in the three parishes here, she offered to undertake the triple roles, realising that this is a vital role in the ministry of the church. Jan's professional life had been in Health and Social care culminating in lecturing and assessing on the subject, with safeguarding being a mandatory and core part of the curriculum.

Jan said "As most people realise, the church in general does not have a good record in safeguarding, with many horrific cases of abuse only now coming to light, and therefore it is extremely important that we do all we can to ensure everyone is fully aware of their own responsibilities.

The role of the PSO is to help everyone understand how they can achieve this, making sure that key people have the appropriate training and also a DBS check. This is part of being compliant with the Church of England and the House of Bishops statement of due diligence with regard to safeguarding. The PSO is also someone who can be approached, in confidence, if you have any concerns about someone. be it about a child or vulnerable adult."



On Sunday 29th January, Jan was commissioned as Parish safeguarding Officer by Revd. Barbara Burton at a joint service for all three parishes held at Walpole St Peter. She will be working closely with all three church councils. However, this role is not just for the benefit of people who attend church but for anyone living within the parishes. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Walpoles Neighbourhood Plan is progressing but the attendance at meetings is very poor, considering the amount of interest that was shown in the beginning. This is for the good of the Parish and future generations. The plan is to preserve what we have and keep away from anything in the future that will destroy the very thing that so many people have moved into these villages for.

Proposals have been put to the Council for them to put out a 'call for sites' for 2 or 3 bed properties avoiding the huge 'fill the plot' houses that have been taking over lately. The majority of responses to the survey said they wanted no more building of any kind.

The Council now have to ask the Parish/ landowners to put forward any possible sites they might be putting forward for planning permission in the future. This does not mean that all those offered will be taken up.

This means there will be notices around the Parish or on line asking anyone who has a possible building site for 2 or 3 bed homes to fill in a form detailing the site position and availability etc. This is early days so more details will come later.

There is also a need for industrial sites for small businesses or 'work from home' units. If anyone has or can suggest suitable sites the Council will be asking you to notify them.

This does not mean that all sites that are offered will be approved as suitable and not all sites will actually be built on. This is merely an exercise to discover potential sites for reasonably sized homes and possible work units.

Another part of the plan is to designate houses and monuments for listing as being of significant interest. Also areas of green spaces that could possibly be protected and therefore never be designated for building.

So be prepared for when the call goes out. Fine details are still being worked on.


